

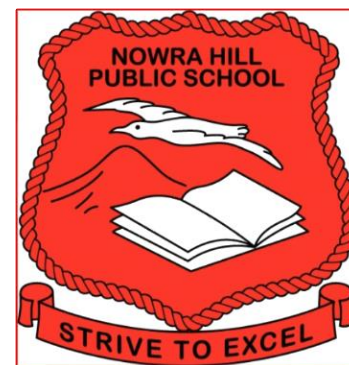

Kinder Orientation

A reminder that our first Kinder Orientation session is tomorrow. The session will start at 9:30am. Information was sent home early this term as to how the session will run. Please bring your child to the office. They will meet with Miss Reminis and be escorted to her classroom to enjoy in some wonderful activities. All parents will be asked to meet with me in the hall for an information session that will run for approximately the hour. At the end of the information session there will a chance to ask questions and speak to the wonderful volunteers in the uniform shop. When our new little people are finished working with Miss Reminis she will bring them back done to the office to meet up with their mums and dads. We ask that parents wait in area around the office and not go to the classroom. This becomes a distraction for your child and we want them to get the best experiences as possible. Thank you for cooperation and we very much look forward to meeting our new little people tomorrow.

Wellbeing

Staff have been working on refining our Wellbeing procedures based on feedback from students, staff and parents. As part of this refinement we have introduced 'Fast and Frequent' in the classrooms and playground. Its purpose is to catch students who are displaying our school values of Respect, Responsibility and Safety. Fast and Frequent were introduced last week with our focus on being an up stander.

Students who were caught displaying our values were given raffle tickets in their house colours. They were asked to write their name and class on the back of the ticket and place it in either the K-2 or 3-6 bucket near the office. At assembly on Friday five names were drawn from each bucket and each child received an ice block. All raffle tickets were then sorted

into each house colour and counted. These will contribute to house points at assembly each Friday. What was extremely impressive was that each child who was drawn from the bucket could tell me why they had received a ticket. Some reasons were for including others, looking after their friends when they were hurt or standing up for children who were having difficulties with peers in the playground.
