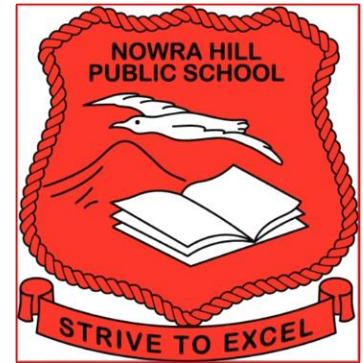
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Dear Parents and Carers

It has been a big start to the week with the Premier announcing the state-wide lockdown with level 4 restriction to NSW Public Schools. We had worked on our home learning packs earlier this term and they only needed a few things added before we could get them out. Teachers came to school Sunday and very early Monday to ensure we were able to get them to you by 10am and I thank them for their dedication to our wonderful students.

Please remember that our concern is the mental health of yourself and your children. We do not expect that children sit from 9am to 3pm completing school work. It is ok if not everything is completed each day. The department expectation is between 2 and 3 hours a day is required for home learning. Other activities like cooking, gardening, construction, building indoor or outdoor cubby houses etc are also all part of learning and the conversations you have with your children about what they are doing are important.

The current restrictions are supposed to be in place until Sunday and at this point I have not heard otherwise. If the restrictions remain we will be in touch with parents to communicate further information.

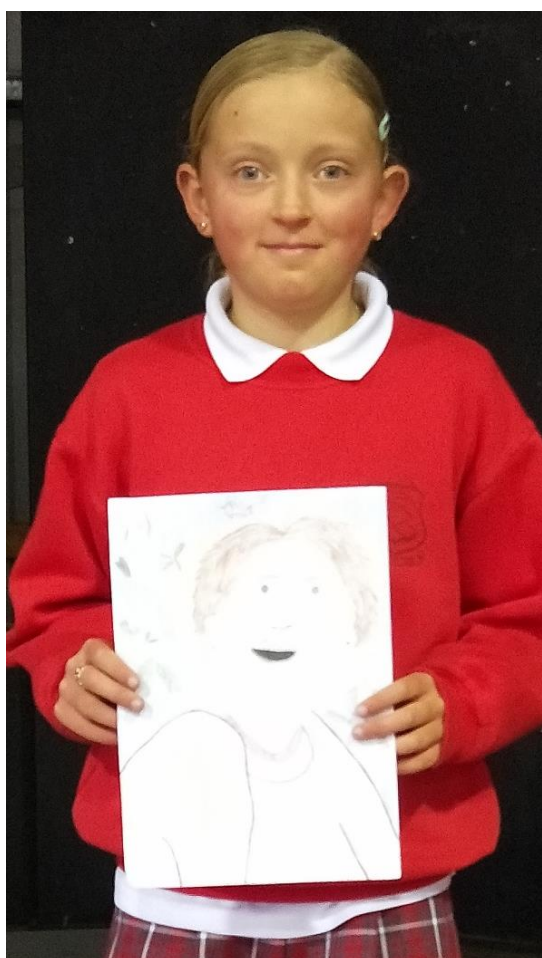
