
Congratulations to Abby who competed at the State Athletics Carnival last Wednesday. A fantastic effort in both shot put and discus. Well done!

TELL THEM FROM ME SURVEY

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. 
