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
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Dear Parents and Carers.

I would like to thank our dedicated teachers who put in time effort and energy to provide our students with amazing opportunities. Recently a big thank you to Mrs Raymer and Mrs Wilson. Our students thrive because of your effort.

I have received notification that there will be a controlled burn behind the naval base tomorrow, weather dependent. The air quality could be quite poor, and I ask that any students who need asthma medication take all precautions tomorrow. Staff have been directed to keep all doors and windows closed and to use air conditioners. Play will also be restricted, and children may need to stay inside at recess and lunch. Last week you would have received notice on Sentral about our school being a category 2 school and what will happen if fire danger ratings are either extreme or catastrophic. Please take the time to read all information. Hopefully, although inconvenient, controlled burns will assist our region and keep us safe.

This Friday is our K-2 athletics carnival from 9.45am – 11.00am. Parents are welcome to come and watch and stay for recess.

Next Thursday is the P & C Colour Run, Thursday 19th September. There are still some families who need to bring in their permission note. Please do so asap as I would hate for anyone to miss out. It's not too late to register and get a little sponsorship. Every cent counts and money raised will assist in the purchase of new marquees. A huge thanks to the P&C, especially Mrs Bruzzese, for their effort to organise this event. Remember the class who raises the most money will be able to slime a teacher of their choice.

Our chickens have arrived. Year 6 students are busy learning how to care for them so they can teach the rest of the classes. So far, they have laid their first dozen eggs. We will be selling the eggs for \$5 a dozen (cash only). All money will be used to purchase chicken feed and buy seeds and seedlings for the class gardens. We are also asking for volunteers to look after the chickens on the weekend. You **do not** need to take them home. We will provide you with a key to the gate and the chicken coop for you to come into school after lunch on Saturday and Sunday to check their feed and water. You can also provide them with a little snack if you like. Any eggs you find are yours for home to say thanks for giving up the time to come to school both days and look after them. If you would like to volunteer please contact the office with your availability and we will arrange for you to sign out the key. Also if you would like to purchase a dozen eggs please contact the office. We will be keeping a list and as soon as we get to your name on the list the office staff will contact you to arrange how they get home. A dozen eggs on the bus on the way home may not be the best option.


MORE INFORMATION
